From Thursday 9 November until Sunday 12 November 2006 a conference will be held within the framework of the Salzburg Annual Conferences on English Literature and Culture on the subject of *Mozart in Anglophone Cultures*.

Wolfgang Amadeus Mozart is not only our *genius loci*, Mozart is what connects Salzburg to the world! In order to commemorate his 250th birthday, we dedicate our 15th international conference to the multiple connections between Mozart and Anglophone Cultures. We invite papers dealing with:

- English translations of Mozart's operas and songs

- The performance history of Mozart's operas on stages in the English-speaking world
- Transformations / adaptations of the libretti for particular performances
- Mozart and English composers: relationships and influences
- The reception of Mozart and his work in English literature, film, and the arts.



Papers will be 30 minutes each, immediately followed by 15 minutes of discussion. In each session of the conference two papers will be given and discussed. In order to enable all participants to appreciate all contributions, the number of papers is limited to a maximum of 26. The conference will be held at the Bildungshaus St. Virgil, Ernst-Grein-Str. 14, an education centre on the slopes of the hills just outside the city and within easy reach of the historic parts of Salzburg. Participants are lodged at the St. Virgil Centre and take their meals there, so that discussions can continue between and after sessions.
